And much more, all taken from the collection of the Museum of modern art. You have been invited to the studios of the artists and their neighborhoods to experiment with the materials they use. Not only have you developed a deeper understanding of how artists work today, but you have also explored some of their many approaches to the pressing issues and questions of our time. By taking this course, you have gained confidence in looking at contemporary art wherever you meet it and making connections with your life or creative practice.
